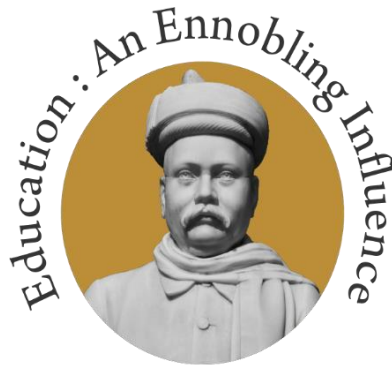

ABOUT GOKHALE INSTITUTE

Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics is one of the oldest research and training Institutes in the field of economics in India. Founded in 1930, with an endowment offered by the late Rao Bahadur R.R. Kale to the Servants of India Society (SIS). SIS was founded by Shri Gopal Krishna Gokhale. The Institute went on to have a rich history and academic research in areas of agricultural economics and rural development, population studies, input-output studies for planning and development, microeconomics, macroeconomics, monetary economics and finance, public economics and international economics.

The objective of the Institute has been to conduct research into the economic and political problems of India and to train researchers in these areas. Furthering this cause, currently, the Institute offers various courses ranging from bachelors to masters and Ph.D. programmes, and by virtue of its expertise in research, often undertakes projects relevant to its core research areas.

The quality of research and education facilitated by Gokhale Institute today has been a joint effort of the current stakeholders and its faculty members. The road for such high standards in the current working of the Institute was paved long back by the first Director of the Institute, late Professor D.R. Gadgil, who prioritized the quality of research, teaching and training at the Institute in a number of branches of economics.

The Institute is registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860, and the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950. For its stellar contribution to Indian society in the form of research work, teaching as well training, the Government of India, on the advice of the University Grants Commission, awarded the Institute the status of a Deemed to be University on May 9, 1993. In the year 2016, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) has reaccredited the Institute with grade A and subsequently in 2025, the Institute is re accredited with B grade. The Institute has also been given 12-B status by the University Grants Commission in 2018.

About the Ph.D. Programme

In tune with the institutional vision and mission, the Institute offers a research programme leading to the Ph.D. degree in multidisciplinary subjects allied with economics. The Ph.D. programme is applied in nature, and students are encouraged to choose research topics that have relevance to the socio-economic problems of the present-day society. The Doctoral Programme, being the flagship programme of the Institute, is the principal scholarly instrument through which the Institute realizes its vision of research-intensive excellence. The Programme is strengthened through structured coursework, rigorous research methodology training, mandatory six-monthly progress evaluation, and pre-synopsis submission seminars. At Gokhale Institute each doctoral candidate has access to the Institute's legendary research ecosystem comprising, the Dr. D. R. Gadgil Library, holding approximately 2,80,000 volumes, 1,875 bound journal titles, around 400 unpublished theses, and subscriptions to approximately 375 periodicals, with twenty-four-hour on-campus access to leading international research databases, econometric and statistical software, survey datasets, and economic archives; specialised research centres; sponsored research and consultancy engagements undertaken for the Government of India, the Government of Maharashtra, the Reserve Bank of India, the Indian Council of Social Science Research, the World Bank, and other national and international agencies; and institutional publications.

The institute provides various incentives to the deserving candidates e.g. a travel grant for presenting papers in national and international conferences.

General Information regarding admission

Candidates must read the prospectus, procedure, and eligibility criteria before applying for the programme. The first and foremost requirement is that candidates must fulfil the essential eligibility criteria to apply for the Ph. D. programme. Candidates must note that the Institute will not refund the '*Application Fee*' to the candidates if they do not fulfil the eligibility criteria.

After completion of the admission process (document verification by the Admission Committee) in all respects, on the recommendation of the Admission Committee, the Institute will confirm their admission and admit the students with a temporary registration for Ph.D. Programme. Selected Candidates must undergo one semester of Ph.D. Course work of 16 credits at the Institute. Upon successful completion of the course with a minimum of **CGPA of 5.5** on a ten-point grading scale, the candidate will be given permanent the Ph.D. registration.

Declaration/Undertaking by Candidates

The candidates, who are admitted to the programme, require to give undertaking as per the UGC norms and Government resolutions at the time of admission/document verification without fail.

Ph. D. Admission 2026-27

The Institute offers the Ph.D. programme through the following two modes:

- i. **Regular Ph.D. Programme**
- ii. **Executive Ph.D. Programme for Working Professionals (Part Time)**

Both modes lead to the same degree of **Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.)** and are governed by the academic standards prescribed under the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2022 and the applicable Ph.D. Rules of the Institute.

Duration of the Programme

- Ph.D. Programme shall be for a minimum duration of three (3) years, including course work, and a maximum duration of six (6) years from the date of admission to the Ph.D. programme.
- A maximum of an additional two (2) years can be given through a process of re-registration on payment of the prescribed fees provided, that the total period for completion of a Ph.D. programme should not exceed eight (8) years from the date of admission in the Ph.D. programme.
- Provided further that, female Ph.D. scholars and Persons with Disabilities (having more than 40% disability) may be allowed an additional relaxation of two (2) years; however, the total period for completion of a Ph.D. programme in such cases should not exceed ten (10) years from the date of admission in the Ph.D. programme.
- Female Ph.D. Scholars may be provided Maternity Leave/Child Care Leave for up to 240 days in the entire duration of the Ph.D. programme.

Coursework

Every admitted scholar must complete the coursework prescribed by the Institute.

The Institute-prescribed coursework shall consist of **16 credits**, including:

- Research Methodology;
- Research and Publication Ethics; and
- Other subject-specific or research-oriented courses approved by the competent academic bodies of the Institute.

A scholar must obtain at least **55% marks or its equivalent grade** in the coursework to continue in the programme and become eligible to submit the Ph.D. thesis.

The Executive Ph.D. Programme for Working Professionals (Part Time) candidates also should complete the prescribed doctoral coursework. To accommodate working professionals, the Institute may schedule coursework through: block teaching, weekend classes, intensive residencies, or other flexible academic formats, without compromising academic standards and 16 mandatory credit requirements.

1. Common Academic Eligibility for Ph.D. Admission

The following academic eligibility requirements apply to both the Regular Ph.D. Programme and the Executive Ph.D. Programme for Working Professionals (Part Time).

A candidate must possess any one of the following:

- (a) Candidates who have completed a two-year/four-semester Master's degree in any discipline after a three-year bachelor's degree, with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade, or a one-year/two-semester Master's degree after a four-year/eight-semester bachelor's degree programme with at least 55% marks in aggregate;
- (b) A qualification declared equivalent to a Master's degree by the UGC, with at least 55% marks in aggregate or an equivalent grade wherever a grading system is followed. CA, CS and CMA/ICWA Qualifications shall be treated as equivalent to a postgraduate degree for the purpose of eligibility, in accordance with the applicable UGC notice.
- (c) Candidates with a four-year/eight-semester bachelor's degree (Honours) with a minimum of 75% marks in aggregate or equivalent grade, as provided under NEP 2020 and UGC Regulations, 2022.
- (d) Candidates with an equivalent qualification from a foreign educational institution accredited by an approved assessment and accreditation agency.
- (e) Candidates who have completed the M.Phil. programme with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed or equivalent qualification from a foreign educational institution accredited by an assessment and accreditation agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country to assess, accredit or assure quality and standards of educational institutions, shall be eligible for admission to the Ph.D. programme.

A relaxation of 5% marks or its equivalent grade shall be allowed for candidates belonging to SC, ST, OBC (non-creamy layer), Differently-Abled, and Economically Weaker Section (EWS) categories as per UGC decisions from time to time.

2. Regular Ph.D. Programme

The Regular Ph.D. Programme is intended for candidates who wish to undertake doctoral research as their principal academic engagement. A scholar is expected to participate regularly in coursework, research seminars, progress presentations, academic activities and other requirements prescribed by the Institute. The scholar must comply with the attendance, residency and academic-engagement requirements specified under the Institute's Ph.D. Rules.

2.1. Eligibility

A candidate must satisfy the **Common Academic Eligibility prescribed in section 1 above**. In addition to the above eligibility requirements, the candidates should also possess any of the following:

- (a) A valid offer of UGC Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) through UGC-NET/ICMR/CSIR/GATE/CEED/ICAR NET examination (JRF Category) and the offer of the JRF is valid at the time of applying.
- (b) Declared eligible for PhD admission based on the valid score through UGC-NET/ICMR/CSIR/GATE/CEED/ICAR NET examination (Non-JRF Category) and the NET score should be valid.

International Students: Students who are not citizens of India shall be admitted through personal interview only. The date of provisional registration for an international student shall be the date of joining after obtaining a valid student/study visa.

2.2 Admission Process

The admission process is different for JRF and Non-JRF holders.

Admission of JRF holders

Candidates qualified for JRF through the UGC NET/ICMR/CSIR/ICAR examination will be admitted solely through personal interviews.

Admission of non-JRF holders

Admission of non-JRF holders and JRF holders who preferred the non-JRF route will be based on the UGC-NET / ICMR/CSIR/ICAR/GATE score and a personal interview. The final selection will be based on the combined scores of the UGC-NET/ICMR/CSIR/ICAR and interview; the scores will be combined by giving 70 per cent weight to the UGC-NET/ICMR/CSIR/ICAR/GATE score and 30 per cent to the interview score.

For International Students

For International Students admission will be based on the personal interview.

*JRF category candidates having valid NET scores can seek admission through the non-JRF route if they prefer. For this, the candidates have to mention this in the relevant field in the application portal, and these candidates will be considered for admission under the non-JRF route, as explained above.

3. Executive Ph.D. Programme for Working Professionals (Part Time)

3.1. Nature of the Programme

The Executive Ph.D. Programme for Working Professionals (Part Time) is intended for experienced professionals who wish to undertake rigorous doctoral research while continuing their employment or professional responsibilities.

It is a **part-time mode of the Ph.D. programme** permitted under Regulation 13 of the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2022.

The programme is not a distance or online Ph.D. programme. Scholars must personally participate in coursework, research reviews, presentations, meetings and other academic requirements as prescribed by the Institute.

3.2. Eligibility

A candidate must satisfy the **Common Academic Eligibility prescribed in section 1 above**. In addition, a candidate must have at least **ten years of professional or work experience after obtaining the qualifying degree or equivalent qualification**.

The Institute will consider experience in:

- government or public-sector organisations;
- research or consulting organisations;
- academic or educational institutions;
- industry, business or corporate organisations;
- professional practice.

The applicant must submit documentary evidence of the claimed experience.

3.3. No Objection Certificate

An employed candidate must submit a No Objection Certificate from the appropriate authority of the organisation where the candidate is employed.

In accordance with the UGC Regulations, the certificate must clearly state that:

1. The candidate is permitted to pursue the Ph.D. programme on a part-time basis;
2. The candidate's official duties permit the candidate to devote sufficient time to research; and
3. The candidate will be relieved from duty, whenever required, to complete the coursework and other mandatory academic requirements.

3.4. Admission Process

Admission to the Executive Ph.D. Programme for Working Professionals (Part Time) shall be based on:

- An entrance test to be conducted by the Institute (weightage 70%); and
- A personal interview (weightage 30%).

The entrance test shall comprise:

- 50% questions on Research Methodology; and
- 50% questions on the relevant subject/discipline.

A candidate must obtain at least **50% marks in the entrance test** to become eligible for the interview. A relaxation of **5% marks in the entrance test** shall be allowed to candidates belonging to SC, ST, OBC, Persons with Disabilities, EWS and other categories as notified by the UGC from time to time.

4. Research Proposal

Along with the completed application form, applicants must submit a well-structured Research Proposal. The maximum word limit is 3000 words. The research proposal shall ordinarily contain:

- (a) Title of the proposed research;
- (b) Statement of the problem;
- (c) Review of literature;
- (d) Research gap;
- (e) Objectives and research questions;
- (f) Proposed methodology;
- (g) Expected contribution;
- (h) Relevance to policy, industry, governance, or practice; and
- (i) Preliminary bibliography.

5. Number of Seats and Norms

- The Institute will admit a total of 20 (Twenty) candidates; 12 (Twelve) candidates under regular mode and 8 (Eight) candidates under the Executive Ph.D. Programme for Working Professionals (Part Time).
- Subject wise vacancies will be as: Economics – 12 (Twelve), Agriculture Economics – 4 (Four) and Population Studies – 4 (Four).
- The Institute follows the Government of India reservation policy in Ph.D. admissions.
- The Institute strictly admits candidates on merit rank, and there is No Management Quota.
- In case of any dispute, the decision of the Admission Selection Committee of the Institute shall be final and binding on the candidates.
- **The registered e-mail address of each candidate will serve as the official channel for all Ph.D. admission correspondence.**
- The candidates must ensure to have all required mandatory documents with them before paying “Admission Fees”.

6. Registration

- Provisional Registration: Candidates admitted to the Ph. D. programme shall be granted provisional registration. The date of provisional registration of a candidate shall be the date on which the candidate joins the Ph.D. programme in the Institute. The date of the provisional registration of an international student shall be the date of joining after obtaining valid student/study visa.
- Confirmation of Registration: The provisional registration shall be confirmed upon successful completion of the prescribed Ph.D. coursework and successful presentation and defence of the Ph. D. proposal.

7. Academic and Research Requirements

A scholar shall:

- maintain regular academic engagement with the Institute;
- undertake research under the supervision of the allotted Research Supervisor;
- appear before the Research Advisory Committee as prescribed;
- submit progress reports at the prescribed intervals;
- participate in seminars and academic activities;
- comply with the Institute’s research-integrity and plagiarism requirements; and
- fulfil all requirements prescribed for submission and evaluation of the thesis.

8. Fellowship and Financial Assistance

Admission to the Ph.D. programme does not automatically entitle a scholar to any fellowship.

Fellowship or financial assistance shall be subject to:

- Applicable funding-agency conditions;
- Validity of the candidate's fellowship award;
- Satisfactory academic progress; and
- The rules and approval of the Institute.

9. Hostel Facility

Limited hostel accommodation may be made available to Regular Ph.D. scholars, subject to availability and payment of the prescribed hostel fees.

Admission to the Ph.D. programme does not guarantee hostel accommodation.

10. How to apply:

Candidates must:

1. Visit the Institute's official website www.gipe.ac.in
2. Open the Ph.D. Admission 2026–27 section;
3. Select either:
 - Regular Ph.D. Programme; or
 - Executive Ph.D. Programme for Working Professionals (Part Time);
4. Complete the online application form;
5. Upload all required documents;
6. Upload the research proposal;
7. Pay the prescribed non-refundable application fee.
8. Submit the application before the notified deadline.

11. Application Fee

The application fee shall be:

- ₹1,200 for General/OBC/EWS candidates; and
- ₹600 for SC/ST candidates.

The fee is non-refundable. Payment-gateway and banking charges, if any, shall be borne by the applicant.

12. Documents Required

Applicants should keep the following documents ready:

- Recent photograph and signature;
- Proof of date of birth;
- Bachelor's degree marksheets and certificate;
- Master's degree marksheets and certificate;
- CA, CS or CMA/ICWA final qualification certificate, where applicable;
- M.Phil. certificate, where applicable;
- NET/JRF or other applicable national-test certificate;
- Category certificate, where applicable;
- OBC Non-Creamy Layer certificate in the prescribed Central Government format;
- EWS certificate in the prescribed Central Government format;
- PwBD certificate, where applicable;
- Work-experience certificates for the Executive Ph.D. Programme for Working Professionals (Part Time);
- NOC for the Executive Ph.D. Programme for Working Professionals (Part Time);
- Research proposal;
- Passport and visa documents for International students; and
- Any other document specified in the admission notification.

13. Verification and Cancellation

Admission shall be provisional until all documents are verified.

The Institute may cancel admission where:

- The candidate does not satisfy the eligibility requirements;
- Any submitted information or document is false, incomplete or misleading;
- The candidate fails to submit the prescribed original documents;
- The qualifying degree or qualification is not recognised; or
- The candidate fails to complete admission formalities within the prescribed period.

Payment of the application fee or appearance in the admission process does not create a right to admission.

14. Communication

The email address and mobile number entered in the application form shall be used for official admission-related communication.

Candidates are responsible for regularly checking:

- their registered email address;
- the admission portal; and
- the Institute's website.

15. Governing Regulations

Admission, registration, coursework, supervision, progress review, thesis submission, evaluation and award of the Ph.D. degree shall be governed by:

- The UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2022;
- Other applicable UGC and Government of India instructions;
- The Institute's Ph.D. Rules, Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations; and
- Decisions of the competent academic and statutory authorities of the Institute.

In the event of any inconsistency, the applicable statutory regulation shall prevail.
